

SYLLABUS

1. Text

The text we will be using is Spanogle, Rohner, Pridgen & Sovern, *Consumer Law* (4th ed. 2013), ISBN # 0314277390. The good news is that it's a brand new edition. The bad news is that it's a brand new edition – less likely to be able to find it used. There is also a statutory supplement, Thomson / West, "Selected Consumer Statutes," ISBN # 0314288627. Because all the statutes are available on line you may wish to download them rather than buy the supplement (it's about \$40). But the paper supplement is convenient (and there are lots of used copies available on Amazon).
